This term your child will be working on this target in their mental maths learning.

7 times table

The minimum expectation of engagement in mental maths homework is the same as reading.

3 times a week for at least 5 minutes each session. KS2 – As a minimum expectation, your child must complete the weekly sessions set for them, by the class teacher on TT-Rockstars. These sessions are monitored by the KS2 team via the online forum. Below are some additional suggestions for activities you could do in a 5 minute session.

<p>Practice your 7 times table during activities eg walking, skipping, singing or in the car.</p>	<p>Set a timer. Hop on the spot for 60 seconds and see how many 7 times tables you can say.</p>	<p>Write your 7 times table on a piece of paper or card without the answers.</p> <p>Get a partner to hide the problems around the room.</p> <p>Your task is to find the problems and write down the answer.</p>

<p>Roll a dice and multiply the number by 7. Play this by yourself or with a partner. Ask your partner the answer.</p>	<p>Using chalk, create your own Hopscotch 7 times table game. Ask a grown up to question your knowledge, for every answer that you get correct jump forward one space, for every incorrect answer, jump back one space. Be as adventurous as you can with the number of squares/markers that you chalk.</p> 	<p>Write the answer to one of the 7 times tables on a partners back e.g 49. They will tell you the problem e.g 7x7. Ask your partner to do the same.</p>
<p>Listen to and join in with 7 times tables song on you tube. There are so many to choose from.</p>	<p>Play on Hit the button</p>  <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/mathsgames/hit-the-button</p>	<p>Write down your 7 times tables.</p> <p>Cut off the answer.</p> <p>Shuffle the answers and the problems.</p> <p>Place upside down .</p> <p>Turn over 1 problem and 1 answer. Do they match?</p> <p>Repeat until all are matched correctly.</p>
