### Expenditure

The employment of two part time teachers for specific small group or individual intervention in literacy and numeracy.

Support in KS1 classes for 1-1 personalised learning support for pupils using 123 Maths and in KS2 online Maths123

Using GL Assessments and LEP scores, children were identified who were not making appropriate progress and targeted with this new scheme. Teachers /Teaching assistants are working to support children using the Maths123 programme to fill gaps in learning and understanding.

Individual work with a counsellor to help support pupils in their social and emotional development and mental well-being

One child has had support from Younger Minds to support their emotional needs. One child has had support from CAMHS.

Apps for I-pads to support whole school teaching and learning for pupils in literacy and numeracy. Apps such as Starspell and Memory Booster have been purchased for use on ipads. The ICT coordinator will continue to monitor impact & usage of the I-pads & apps used.

School visits – Shugborough (Y4) and various school trips throughout the year

Children able to develop confidence, knowledge and cooperation with their peers.

6 stand alone computers and headphones have been purchased for use in the group learning classroom. These computers have been used for various intervention groups and its use and impact will be monitored.

#### Reading

FSM children in EYFS, Year 2 and 4 making better than expected progress – outstanding progress.  
 FSM children in Year 1 making expected progress– good progress.  
 FSM children in Year 3 making less than expected progress – Those children who didn't make expected progress need to be targeted in September. (see End of Year Progress Table)  
 All non FSM children in EYFS, KS1 and 2 made better than expected progress – outstanding progress!

#### Writing

FSM and Non FSM children in EYFS and Years 2, 3 and 4 made better than expected progress – outstanding.  
 In Year 3 FSM children made better than expected progress although Non FSM scored slightly higher – good progress.  
 In Year 1 FSM making expected progress – good.

#### Maths

In years 1-3 FSM children made better than expected progress but Non FSM scored just slightly higher – outstanding progress.  
 In Year 4 FSM and Non FSM made better than expected progress – outstanding progress!  
 In EYFS Non FSM made better than expected progress and FSM made expected progress – good.

Overall judgement – outstanding progress!
