Dear Parents/Carers,

EXCITING ANNOUNCEMENT... We have hired a pop up swimming pool!

Swim England reports that - 'the enforced closure of pools as a result of Covid-19 may be the longest many have been out of the water for, which can adversely affect both their physical and mental wellbeing.

At SEAC we realise that many children have not had the opportunities to attend swimming lessons due to closures and long waiting lists. As a result, we have invested in hiring a pool for three weeks at the beginning of November, complete with life guard and instructors, that will enable **ALL** children in the school to participate in a swimming lessons.

There has been a significant cost to this, but we firmly believe that this will outweigh the benefit to the children, both mentally and physically. We ask that you ensure your child/children have their swimming kits in school on the designated days. For some of the older children, this will be multiple times a week to ensure the biggest impact is made. To help with the management of the changing rooms, the classes will split in to girls and boys groups, who will then swim separately.

Swimming kit required in a named bag.

- Swimming trunks / costume - Trunks rather than shorts for boys and one piece costumes for girls are the most ideal as they are easier for the children to swim in, causing less resistance. Two piece swimming costumes (such as bikinis/tankinis) are not acceptable.
- Swimming hat - These are suggested and preferred for boys with short hair, but not compulsory. It is, however, compulsory for girls or boys with long hair.
- Towel
