



Reception SEAC Mental Maths Homework for Summer Term 1





This half term your child will be working on these targets in their mental maths learning.

Number bonds to 10

The minimum expectation of engagement in mental maths homework is the same as reading.

3 times a week for at least 5 minutes each session. Below are some suggestions for activities you could do in a 5 minute session.

Verbal	Practical	Written
Subitising plates - Using paper plates draw representations of numbers 1-10. E.g. number 7: 5 red dots and 2 black dots. Use the plates to help your child recall facts to 10.	Pair the aliens to total 10 – ‘Practise Activity 1’ https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zh8m6v4	A selection of calculations written for the child to practice E.g $5 + 2 = 7$, $6 + 4 = 10$
Number bond tennis to total 10. You say a number and you child ‘bounces’ a number back to you e.g. you say 8, they say 2 to total 10.	Tidy away time: Ask your child to bring you a specific amount of different objects they are tidying e.g. 8. How do you know you have 8? E.g. I have 5 cars and 3 dinosaurs.	Ask your child to be the teacher and mark the calculations you have written. (You need to write some incorrectly for them to mark too. E.g $4+2 = 5$ $6+2 = 9$)
Show groups of objects, E.g. 6 cars, ask questions to justify your child’s answer. E.g. How many more cars would you need to add to make 10? What can you tell me about the number 10?	Play on Hit the button – click ‘number bonds’, then ‘make 10’  https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button	Write the answers down E.g 2, 7, 10, 8 and ask your child to write the calculations relating to their target to match the answer.
Use a random number generator to pick a number between 1 and 10. http://ichoice.io/ten-random-numbers  Your child sees the number and calculates E.g 8 and 2 is 10.	A game of go fish: You have cards with calculations on and cards with answers on and you place them face down on the table. Can your child find the matching calculations and answers? Number bonds to 10 target – put number cards face down. Find the pairs that make 10 when added together.
